1. THE FOLLOWING RULES SUPERSEDE ALL PREVIOUS RULES OF THIS STOCK SHOW AND WILL REPLACE THEM IN THEIR ENTIRETY. THE SHOW RESERVES ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS, THE FINAL AND ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS AND ARBITRARILY SETTLE AND DETERMINE ALL MATTERS, QUESTIONS, DIFFERENCES IN REGARD AS ITS JUDGMENT MAY DETERMINE. THE SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS ,BOARD OF DIRECTORS, SHOW OFFICIALS, ADVISORS, AND DIVISION SUPERINTENDENTS WILL NOT BE LIABLE FOR INJURIES RESULTING FROM ACCIDENTS TO EXHIBITORS, SPECTATORS OR LIVESTOCK. EACH SPONSORING ORGANIZATION SHALL CONTRIBUTE NO LESS THAN \$500.00 FOR EACH TWO (2) SEATS ON THE BOARD. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS WILL BE COMPOSED OF TWO DIRECTORS FROM EACH OF THE SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS: POTH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, STOCKDALE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, THE VFW POST #8555, WILSON COUNTY FARM BUREAU, AND THE FLORESVILLE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. THERE WILL ALSO BE TWO VOTING MEMBERS FROM THE WILSON COUNTY SHOWBARN COMMITTEE, ONE VOTING MEMBER FROM EACH FFA CHAPTER BEING POTH FFA, STOCKDALE FFA, FLORESVILLE FFA, AND LAVERNIA FFA AND TWO VOTING MEMBERS FROM THE WILSON COUNTY 4-H CLUBS. AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE TEACHERS AND COUNTY EXTENSION AGENTS ACT AS ADVISORS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. PRIZE MONEY WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE DIRECTORS OF THE SHOW IF THE MONEY IS AVAILABLE. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE GIVEN TO MARKET ANIMALS, BROILERS OR TURKEYS.

ALL DIVISION SUPERINTENDENTS WILL BE SELECTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS BY A MAJORITY VOTE. SUPERINTENDENTS MAY ALSO BE REMOVED BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

2. PARTICIPATION IN THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK DIVISION AND/OR AGRICULTURAL MECHANICS PROJECT SHOW IS LIMITED TO:
 1. STUDENTS ENROLLED IN PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOLS
 2. A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING OF A 4-H CLUB, FFA OR FCCLA CHAPTER WITHIN WILSON COUNTY AND WHO HAVE CONTINUOUSLY, PERSONALLY FED AND CARED FOR THEIR ANIMALS OR BUILT THEIR PROJECT(S) UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF A CEA OR AST.
 3. THEY MUST BE IN THE THIRD GRADE OR NINE YEARS OLD BUT NOT MORE THAN 19 YEARS OLD ON JANUARY 1.
 4. THEY MUST BE A FULL-TIME RESIDENT OF WILSON COUNTY.
 5. HOME SCHOOLED CHILDREN ARE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW AS LONG AS THEY MEET THE OTHER REQUIREMENTS LISTED HERE.

**** IF ANY OF THE QUALIFICATIONS ARE IN QUESTION, THIS MUST BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AS SOON AS THE SITUATION PRESENTS ITSELF. ****

3. ALL ENTRIES MUST HAVE BEEN OWNED AND UNDER THE CARE, CUSTODY AND CONTROL OF THE EXHIBITOR AND THE EXHIBITOR'S PARENTS WITH THE SUPERVISION OF THE RESPECTIVE AG TEACHER OR COUNTY AGENT AS OF THE INDICATED VALIDATION DATE OR OWNERSHIP DATE. THIS IS TO ALSO MEAN THE ENTRY MUST BE ON THE SAID EXHIBITOR'S PROPERTY OR APPROVED PROPERTY. (PROPERTY TO BE APPROVED BY THE AG TEACHER OR COUNTY AGENT.)

IF ANY ANIMAL IS OUT OF THE EXHIBITOR'S POSSESSION, THEY MUST NOTIFY THEIR AG TEACHER OR COUNTY AGENT OF THE MOVEMENT. THE EXHIBITOR AGREES TO SUBMIT ANY ANIMAL, BREEDING OR MARKET, FOR VERIFICATION OF OWNERSHIP OR IDENTITY AT THE DISCRETION OF THE DIRECTORS.

ALL MARKET STEERS, LAMBS, HOGS, RABBITS, AND GOATS MUST BE VALIDATED. ALL MARKET SPECIES WILL ALSO HAVE A VALIDATION FEE CHARGED. THIS VALIDATION FEE DOES NOT CONSTITUTE AN ENTRY TO ANY LIVESTOCK SHOW. ENTRY FEES FOR EACH ANIMAL FOR THE LIVESTOCK SHOW WILL BE SUBMITTED SEPARATELY DURING THE ENTRY FEE DEADLINES

4. AN EXHIBITOR MUST SHOW/SELL HIS/HER OWN PROJECT - EXCEPTION: ILLNESS, EMERGENCY, DEATH IN FAMILY, WHEN 2 OR MORE ANIMALS ARE ELIGIBLE TO BE SHOWN IN ONE CLASS, OR ANOTHER SCHOOL RELATED OR UIL EVENT NOT INCLUDING ANOTHER LIVESTOCK SHOW. IN THE EVENT OF ONE OF THE ABOVE EXCEPTIONS, A SUBSTITUTE EXHIBITOR MUST BE A FAMILY MEMBER, ELIGIBLE TO SHOW/SELL; IF NOT APPLICABLE, THEN MUST BE A BONAFIDE MEMBER OF THE EXHIBITOR'S CLUB OR CHAPTER. IN THE EVENT OF ILLNESS, A DOCTOR'S RELEASE MUST BE PRESENTED TO THE SUPERINTENDENT BEFORE A SUBSTITUTE EXHIBITOR CAN SHOW/SELL THE ILL EXHIBITOR'S ANIMAL; OR IN THE EVENT AN EXHIBITOR BECOMES ILL OR INJURED AT THE WILSON COUNTY JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW THEN THE SUPERINTENDENT MUST BE NOTIFIED BY THE EXHIBITOR'S PARENT OR THE EXHIBITOR'S ADVISOR FOR APPROVAL OF SUBSTITUTE EXHIBITOR PRIOR TO THE JUDGING/SELLING OF THE ANIMAL.
5. EVERY EXHIBITOR MUST BE GRADE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW THEIR ANIMAL PROJECT ACCORDING TO CURRENT UIL RULES AT THE TIME OF THE SHOW/AUCTION SALE. IF THE EXHIBITOR IS INELIGIBLE, THEIR ANIMAL CAN NOT SHOW. IN THE EVENT AN EXHIBITOR IS ELIGIBLE TO SHOW BUT NOT GRADE ELIGIBLE FOR THE AUCTION SALE, THEIR SALE SLOT IS FORFIETED TO THE NEXT ELIGIBLE PERSON.
6. IN THE EVENT A BREEDING ANIMAL DIES, THE EXHIBITOR CAN HAVE THEIR SUPERVISING AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE TEACHER OR COUNTY EXTENSION AGENT PROPOSE TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO ALLOW THE EXHIBITOR TO SHOW ANOTHER BREEDING ANIMAL IN PLACE OF THE ANIMAL THAT DIED. THE NEW ANIMAL MUST BE OF THE SAME SPECIES AND THE EXHIBITOR MUST BE ABLE TO SHOW, IN WRITING FROM A VETERINARIAN, THAT THE ANIMAL DIED OF NATURAL CAUSES. ALL OF THESE CASES WILL CONSIDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ON A CASE BY CASE BASIS.
7. ALL MARKET ANIMALS WILL BE SIFTED/CLASSIFIED. THE SIFTING/CLASSIFYING JUDGES WILL BE INSTRUCTED TO ACCEPT ONLY SHOW QUALITY ANIMALS IN THE WILSON COUNTY JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW. DECISIONS OF THE SIFTING/CLASSIFYING JUDGES WILL BE FINAL. THE DECISIONS OF THE SIFTING/CLASSIFYING JUDGES ARE NOT SUBJECT TO APPEAL OR PROTEST. ALL SIFTED ANIMALS ARE TO BE REMOVED BY THE EXHIBITOR IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING WEIGH-IN. AFTER AN ENTRY HAS BEEN ACCEPTED AND APPROVED BY THE SIFTING/CLASSIFYING JUDGES, NO SUBSTITUTIONS OF THE ANIMAL OR POULTRY WILL BE ALLOWED FOR ANY REASON.
8. THERE WILL BE NO REWEIGHING ONCE AN ANIMAL'S OFFICIAL WEIGHT HAS BEEN RECORDED AND VERIFIED. IN THE EVENT AN ANIMAL IS SIFTED DUE TO WEIGHT, THE ANIMAL WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO BE REWEIGHED ONE TIME IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE SCALE HAS BEEN REBALANCED.

GENERAL RULES

9. APPLICATION FOR ENTRY: FEES WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

CATTLE -	\$15.00 PER HEAD	SWINE -	\$15.00 PER HEAD

BREEDING RABBITS -	\$15.00 PER ENTRY	HORSE SHOW	\$15.00 PER ENTRY

A \$5 PER ENTRY FEE WILL BE ADDED IN ADDITION TO THE ENTRY FEE FOR CLEAN-UP OF THE WILSON COUNTY SHOWBARN DURING THE SHOW. HALF OF THE ENTRY FEE, LESS THE \$5 CLEAN-UP FEE WILL BE PAID TO THE SHOWBARN FOR USE OF THE FACILITY. ALL ENTRIES, INCLUDING AG MECHANICS ENTRIES, ARE DUE AND MUST BE SUBMITTED TO IMMEDIATE SUPERVISOR ON OR BEFORE **DECEMBER 1, 2011**. BAKED FOOD ENTRANTS SHOULD REFER TO THE BAKED FOOD SHOW RULES.

LATE ENTRIES MAY BE ACCEPTED FOR ALL PROJECTS UNTIL THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WILSON COUNTY JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW **IN JANUARY 2012**. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY TURN AWAY ANY LATE ENTRIES WITHOUT EXPLANATION. IF ACCEPTED, LATE ENTRIES WILL BE CHARGED TWICE THE STANDARD RATE.

10. EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS/HER ENTRY THROUGHOUT THE SHOW. EXHIBITORS WILL KEEP THEIR EXHIBIT IN SHOW ORDER AT ALL TIMES. ANY EXHIBITOR FAILING TO COMPLY WITH THIS RULE, WILL FORFEIT ALL PRIZE MONEY.
11. ALL GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION ANIMALS MUST SELL IN THE AUCTION SALE. THESE ANIMALS WILL BE COUNTED IN THE PERCENTAGES ALLOWED IN THE SALE. ALL OTHER MARKET ANIMALS ELIGIBLE FOR THE SALE WILL BE GIVEN THE OPTION TO SELL OR NOT TO SELL. IF AN ANIMAL PULLS OUT OF THE SALE, THE NEXT ELIGIBLE ANIMAL IN THAT CLASS WILL MOVE UP. ALL MARKET ANIMALS WILL GO THROUGH THE SALE SELLING BY THE HEAD AS A PREMIUM SALE. (THE AUCTION WILL CONSIST OF 75% OF THE STEER EXHIBITORS, 60% OF HOG EXHIBITORS, 60% OF LAMB EXHIBITORS, 60% OF THE BROILER EXHIBITORS (ROUNDED TO EQUAL COCKEREL PENS AND PULLET PENS), 50% OF MEAT PEN RABBIT EXHIBITORS, 60% OF THE TURKEY EXHIBITORS (ROUNDED TO EQUAL NUMBER OF TOMS AND HENS) AND 50% OF GOAT EXHIBITORS) AN EXHIBITOR MAY SHOW AS MANY MARKET ANIMALS AS THE DIVISION RULES PERMIT. EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE PERMITTED TO SELL ONLY ONE. **EXCEPTION:** IN THE EVENT AN EXHIBITOR HAS MORE THAN ONE GRAND OR RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION, HE/SHE WILL SELL THEM. IN THE EVENT ALL OF THE SALE SLOTS FOR ONE DIVISION OR SPECIES CAN NOT BE FILLED; ALL EXHIBITORS ONE PLACE OUT OF QUALIFYING FOR THE SALE WILL HAVE THEIR NAME PUT INTO HAT OR POOL. THE BOARD PRESIDENT WILL THEN DRAW NAMES FROM THE HAT OR POOL TO FILL THOSE SLOTS.
12. AN AUCTION FEE OF 5% IS TO BE DEDUCTED FROM ALL AUCTION SALE ITEMS. THREE (3%) PERCENT OF THIS FEE IS TO BE PAID TO THE SHOWBARN FOR RENTAL OF THE FACILITY. TWO (2%) PERCENT OF THE FEE WILL BE UTILIZED BY THE WCJLS FOR OPERATING EXPENSES.
13. ALL CATTLE MUST BE BROKE TO HALTER - DISORDERLY ANIMALS WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOW AND SALE RING AT THE DISCRETION OF THE DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT. BULLS OVER ONE (1) YEAR OF AGE MUST BE SHOWN WITH A NOSE RING.
14. THE RESPECTIVE SUPERINTENDENT WILL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO DISQUALIFY ANIMALS FOR RULE VIOLATIONS - THIS TO INCLUDE CONDUCT OF EXHIBITOR.
15. THE RING AREA MUST BE CLEARED OF UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS - THIS TO INCLUDE ANY PERSON NOT ASSISTING SUPERINTENDENTS. THE AISLES IN THE BARN WILL BE KEPT CLEAR OF SPECTATORS AND DEBRIS DURING THE MOVING OF ANIMALS INTO AND OUT OF THE RING. EACH DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT HAS THE AUTHORITY TO REMOVE ANY DISPLAY, SHOWBOX, TRIM CHUTE OR ANY OTHER OBSTRUCTION HE FEELS INTERFERE WITH THE STALLING OR SAFETY OF ANY EXHIBIT OR EXHIBITOR. EXHIBITORS WILL KEEP THE BUILDING CLEAN AND WILL ASSIST THE SUPERINTENDENTS WHEN ASKED TO DO SO.
16. A \$5.00 FEE WILL BE ASSESSED TO EACH SALE ITEM OF THE SHOW. THIS FEE WILL PAY FOR THE HOSPITALITY ROOM FOOD, BEVERAGES AND OTHER NECESSARY ITEMS. THE FOOD PROVIDED WILL BE IN LIEU OF THE PREVIOUS APPRECIATION DINNER.

GENERAL RULES

17. ANYONE WISHING TO PROTEST ANY ACTION OF THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE OR SOME EVENT REGARDING THE SHOW MUST SUBMIT SAID PROTEST, IN WRITING, ACCOMPANIED BY A DEPOSIT OF \$50.00, WHICH WILL BE FORFEITED IF THE PROTEST IS NOT SUSTAINED. WRITTEN PROTEST MUST CLEARLY STATE THE CAUSE FOR COMPLAINT OR APPEAL AND MUST BE IN THE HANDS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS BY 6:00 P.M. ON FRIDAY OF THE SHOW. PROTESTED ENTRIES, THAT CANNOT BE SETTLED IMMEDIATELY, WILL BE SHOWN "UNDER PROTEST" AND "SELL UNDER PROTEST". SALE MONEY WILL BE KEPT UNTIL THE MATTER IN QUESTION IS SETTLED.
18. PARKING OF TRAILERS AND VEHICLES WILL BE IN DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY.
19. ALL ANIMALS WILL NOT BE RELEASED UNTIL THE DESIGNATED RELEASE TIMES IN THE SCHEDULE. EXHIBITS REMOVED EARLIER WILL FORFEIT PRIZE MONEY.
20. **A SINGLE AWARD WILL BE AWARDED TO THE GRAND CHAMPION AG MECHANIC WINNER AND A PLAQUE WILL GO TO THE RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION. THE OVERALL GRAND CHAMPION WILL BE AWARDED A TRAVELING TROPHY AND PLAQUE FOR THE ENTRY.** BLUE, RED, AND WHITE RIBBONS WILL BE AWARDED TO ALL AG MECHANICS PROJECTS. ONLY BLUE RIBBON WINNERS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR GRAND AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION OF THE SHOW. THOSE EXHIBITORS DESIRING TO SELL THEIR AG MECHANICS PROJECT MAY SELL IN A SILENT AUCTION, SUBJECT TO ALL REQUIRED FEES. RESULTS OF THE SILENT AUCTION WILL BE ANNOUNCED SATURDAY NIGHT DURING THE AUCTION SALE OF THE MARKET ANIMALS. ONLY BLUE AND RED RIBBON WINNERS ARE ALLOWED TO SELL IN THE SILENT AUCTION.

THE AG MECHANICS SUPERINTENDENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR COLLECTING ALL FINAL BIDS FROM THE SILENT AUCTION. BUYERS WILL MAKE ALL CHECKS FOR PROJECTS PURCHASED PAYABLE TO WCJLS OR THE BUYER WILL BE BILLED AT THE END OF THE SHOW. NO EXHIBITOR OF A SALE ITEM WILL RECEIVE DIRECT PAYMENT FROM THE BUYER NOR WILL A BUYER PAY THE AG MECHANIC EXHIBITOR DIRECTLY

21. SHOWMANSHIP AWARD: TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS AWARD, AN EXHIBITOR MUST OWN AND HAVE EXHIBITED AT THIS SHOW THE ANIMAL SHOWN. THERE WILL BE THREE DIVISIONS IN THE SHOWMANSHIP JUDGING - THESE BEING: JUNIOR: 8-11 YEARS OF AGE; INTERMEDIATE: 12-14; AND SENIORS: 15-18 YEARS OF AGE AS OF THE DATE OF THE SHOW. WINNERS TO BE RECOGNIZED AT SATURDAY NIGHT'S SALE.

SHOWMANSHIP AWARDS WILL BE JUDGED AFTER THE SHOW. ANY EXHIBITOR INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING IN THE SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST CAN COME BACK AFTER THE SHOW AND PARTICIPATE AND COMPETE IN THE SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST.

22. EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT IN WRITING TO THEIR RESPECTIVE SUPERINTENDENT WHICH ANIMAL THEY WISH TO SELL. **IF AN EXHIBITOR SHOWS ONLY ONE SPECIES, THE EXHIBITOR MUST DECLARE WITHIN ONE HOUR AFTER THE SPECIES IS SHOWN WHICH ANIMAL THEY WISH TO SELL.** EXHIBITOR HAS ONE HOUR FROM THE TIME THEIR SHOW IS FINISHED TO REPORT IF THEY WISH TO SELL THAT ANIMAL. IN THE EVENT AN EXHIBITOR HAS MORE THAN ONE ANIMAL QUALIFYING FOR THE SALE, THEY MUST REPORT TO THE RESPECTIVE SUPERINTENDENT OF EACH OF THESE ANIMALS WITHIN ONE HOUR WHICH ANIMAL THEY WISH TO PULL FROM THE SALE. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH EXHIBITOR TO DECLARE WHICH ANIMAL WILL BE SOLD. IF AN EXHIBITOR FAILS TO DECLARE THE ANIMAL THEY WISH TO SELL, THE SALE COMMITTEE (COMPOSED OF A SELECTED GROUP OF DIRECTORS AND SUPERINTENDENTS) WILL SELECT THE ANIMAL TO BE IN THE SALE.
23. THE COMMITTEE USED TO DEVELOP THE CLASSES OF ALL SPECIES WILL CONSIST OF THE SHOW MANAGER, SUPERINTENDENT(S), AND A DIRECTOR
24. IF AN EXHIBITOR WHO HAS BECOME ELIGIBLE TO SELL AT THE AUCTION IS NOT IN LINE AT THEIR TIME IN THE SALE, THE EXHIBITOR WILL FORFEIT SELLING IN THE AUCTION. THE AUCTION WILL NOT ALLOW THE FORFEITED LOT TO SELL LATER IN THE SALE.
25. - F. AMERICAN BREED CROSSES - MUST SHOW MINIMUM OF 3/16 AMERICAN INFLUENCE - STEERS MAY BE ENTERED IN THIS CLASS OR BE CLASSIFIED OUT OF THE BRAHMAN CLASS, PROVIDED THEY SHOW AT LEAST 3/16 AMERICAN VISUAL BREED CHARACTERISTICS
- G. BRITISH BREED CLASS - MUST SHOW 100% BRITISH BREED CHARACTERISTICS. THE BRITISH BREEDS ARE PUREBRED HEREFORD, PUREBRED POLLED HEREFORD, PUREBRED ANGUS, PUREBRED RED ANGUS AND PUREBRED SHORTHORN.
- H. EXOTIC BREED CLASS - INCLUDE ANY ANIMAL WHICH DOES NOT CLASSIFY AS A BRAHMAN CROSS, AMERICAN BREED OR A BRITISH ANIMAL.
- I. ALL STEERS WILL BE SIFTED AND CLASSIFIED AS THEY ARE WEIGHED-IN.
- J. THERE SHOULD BE NO CHANGE OR ALTERING OF THE ANIMAL'S MAJOR COLOR OR COLOR PATTERNS. THE USE OF TWINE, STRINGING OR ANY FOREIGN OBJECT WILL BE PROHIBITED IN ANY FITTING PRACTICE. ANY VIOLATION OF THESE RULES WILL CONSTITUTE DISQUALIFICATION.

- B. SWINE MUST WEIGH AT LEAST 190 POUNDS AND MAY NOT WEIGH MORE THAN 270 POUNDS.
- C. MARKET HOGS MAY BE PUREBRED OR CROSSBRED. CLASSIFICATION OF MARKET SWINE WILL FOLLOW THE MAJOR SHOW GUIDELINES AS FOLLOWS:

BERKSHIRE

- 1. BLACK AND WHITE WITH ERECT EARS EXHIBITING BERKSHIRE CHARACTER.
- 2. A BERKSHIRE MUST HAVE WHITE ON FACE AND TAIL (UNLESS TAIL IS DOCKED). THREE OF THE FOUR LEGS MUST BE WHITE.
- 3. A BERKSHIRE MUST NOT HAVE A SOLID WHITE OR A SOLID BLACK FACE FROM THE EARS FORWARD.
- 4. A BERKSHIRE MUST NOT HAVE A SOLID BLACK NOSE (RIM OF NOSE).
- 5. WHITE IS ALLOWED ON THE EARS, BUT NEITHER EAR CAN BE ENTIRELY WHITE.
- 6. AN OCCASIONAL SPLASH OF WHITE MAY APPEAR ON THE BODY.

HAMPSHIRE

- 1. MUST BE BLACK IN COLOR WITH A WHITE BELT STARTING ON A FRONT LEG. THE BELT MAY PARTIALLY OR TOTALLY ENCIRCLE THE BODY.
- 2. MUST POSSES HAMPSHIRE BREED CHARACTER. (EARS MUST BE ERECT AND NOT ROUNDED)
- 3. MUST NOT HAVE ANY WHITE HAIR OR INDICATIONS OF STREAKING ON THE FOREHEAD.
- 4. MUST NOT HAVE ANY RED HAIR.

SPOTTED SWINE

- 1. MUST BE BLACK AND WHITE.
- 2. MUST POSSESS SPOTTED BREED CHARACTER.
- 3. EARS CANNOT BE ERECT.
- 4. ANY RED TINTED OR BROWN SPOTS ARE INELIGIBLE.
- 5. NO SOLID BLACK HEAD FROM EARS FORWARD.
- 6. NO DISTINCT WHITE BELT PATTERN (HAIR OR SKIN) ENCIRCLING AND EXTENDING DOWN AND ONTO EACH SHOULDER.
- 7. ANY SIGNS OF WEIGHTED EAR TAGS OR EVIDENCE OF PAST EXISTENCE SUCH EAR TAGS ARE DETERMINED TO BE NOT PERMISSIBLE AND ARE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION.

SPECIES RULES

DUROC

1. MUST BE RED IN COLOR AND POSSES DUROC BREED CHARACTER (EARS MUST BE DOWN AND MEDIUM SIZE)
2. MUST NOT HAVE ANY WHITE HAIR LOCATED ON THE ANIMAL.
3. MUST NOT HAVE ANY BLACK HAIR.
4. MUST NOT HAVE MORE THAN THREE BLACK SPOTS ON THE SKIN AND NONE OF THESE SPOTS CAN BE LARGER THAN TWO INCHES IN DIAMETER.
5. MUST NOT HAVE ANY SHADING OR INDICATION OF A BELT.

POLAND CHINA

1. MUST POSSES POLAND CHINA BREED CHARACTER.
2. MUST BE BLACK WITH A WHITE FACE AND SWITCH (UNLESS TAIL IS DOCKED). THREE OF THE FOUR LEGS MUST BE WHITE. MAY HAVE AN OCCASIONAL SPLASH OF WHITE ON THE BODY.
3. MUST HAVE EARS DOWN.
4. MUST NOT HAVE EVIDENCE OF BELT FORMATION.
5. CANNOT HAVE ANY RED OR SANDY HAIR AND/OR PIGMENT.
6. HOGS THAT HAVE WEIGHTED EAR TAGS OR EVIDENCE OF TAMPERING OF EARS WITH POSSIBLE EAR TAGS ARE INELIGIBLE.

CHESTER WHITE

1. MUST POSSESS CHESTER WHITE BREED CHARACTER.
2. MUST BE SOLID WHITE IN COLOR, NO COLOR ON THE SKIN LARGER THAN A SILVER DOLLAR, NO COLORED HAIR.
3. EARS MUST BE DOWN AND MEDIUM SIZE.
4. ANY SIGNS OF WEIGHTED EAR TAGS OR EVIDENCE OF PAST EXISTENCE OF SUCH EAR TAGS ARE DETERMINED TO BE NOT PERMISSIBLE AND ARE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION.

LANDRACE

1. MUST BE WHITE IN COLOR AND POSSESS LANDRACE BREED CHARACTER. (EARS MUST BE DOWN).
2. MUST NOT ALLOW ANY COLOR HAIR OTHER THAN WHITE.
3. MUST NOT ALLOW MORE THAN THREE SPOTS OF SKIN PIGMENTATION.
4. MUST NOT ALLOW ANY SPOT OF SKIN PIGMENTATION LARGER THAN ONE U.S. MINTED QUARTER.

YORKSHIRE

1. MUST BE WHITE IN COLOR AND POSSESS YORKSHIRE BREED CHARACTER. (EARS MUST BE ERECT)
2. MUST NOT HAVE ANY COLORED HAIR OTHER THAN WHITE.
3. MUST NOT HAVE COLORED SKIN PIGMENTATION LARGER THAN ONE U.S. MINTED SILVER DOLLAR.
4. MUST NOT HAVE MASKING ABOVE THE EYES LARGER THAN A SILVER DOLLAR.

CROSSBRED

BARROWS OF ANY COLORATION PATTERN OR PIGMENTATION ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY IN THIS BREED.

- D. MARKET HOGS WILL BE DIVIDED BY BREEDS: IF MORE THAN 7 HOGS OF ONE BREED QUALIFY FOR THE SHOW, THEY WILL SHOW AS A BREED OF THEIR OWN, ALL OTHERS WILL BE SHOWN AS OPB. THESE WILL BE BROKEN INTO CLASSES BY WEIGHT.
- E. CLASSES WILL BE ESTABLISHED UPON THE BASIS OF THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES, 1 TO 12 ENTRIES WILL EQUAL ONE CLASS, 13 TO 23 ENTRIES WILL EQUAL TWO CLASSES; 24 TO 39 ENTRIES WILL EQUAL THREE CLASSES; OVER 39 ENTRIES CONSTITUTE FOUR CLASSES.
- F. ALL MARKET AND BREEDING SWINE WILL BE UNLOADED BETWEEN 3:00 PM AND 6:00 PM, **WEDNESDAY JANUARY 19, 2011**. ALL HOGS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 6:00 PM. CLASSIFYING AND WEIGHING WILL BEGIN AT 6:00 PM CALLED BY BREEDS

SPECIES RULES

- D. THE MINIMUM WEIGHT ON LAMBS WILL BE 85 POUNDS FOR SOUTHDOWN, 100 POUNDS FOR MEDIUM WOOL, AND 100 POUNDS FOR FINEWOOL CROSSES AND FINEWOOLS WITH NO MAXIMUM WEIGHT. . - E. LAMBS MUST BE SLICK SHEARED FROM THE KNEE AND HOCK UP AT THE TIME OF SIFTING. BLANKETS MUST BE REMOVED FOR WEIGHING, SIFTING AND CLASSIFYING.
- F. ALL LAMBS WILL BE WEIGHED AND DIVIDED INTO WEIGHT GROUPS AS EQUALLY AS POSSIBLE BY SHOW OFFICIALS. THE NUMBER OF CLASSES DEPENDS ON THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES IN EACH BREED.
- G. A FINEWOOL CROSS LAMB IS DEFINED AS A FIRST CROSS BETWEEN A FINEWOOL AND MEDIUM WOOL.
- H. *LAMB STALLING WILL BE ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS. NO STALLS MAY BE RESERVED PRIOR TO THE DAY OF THE SHOW.*

IV. BROILERS:

- A. BIRDS MUST BE OF COMMERCIAL TYPE - RATHER THAN SHOW TYPE - MUST BE PURCHASED FROM THE SAME HATCHERY AND HATCHING.
- B. EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW TWO PENS OF BROILERS.
- C. THERE WILL BE NO WEIGHT LIMIT.
- D. THREE BIRDS WILL CONSTITUTE A PEN.
- E. BIRDS WILL BE STRAIGHT RUN BIRDS (BOTH PULLETS AND COCKERELS MAY BE SHOWN)
- F. BIRDS WILL BE SIFTED ON QUALITY (GRADE A)
- G. BROILERS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO TWO (2) CLASSES – PULLETS AND COCKERELS

V. TURKEYS:

- A. ALL TURKEY POULTS MUST BE OF COMMERCIAL TYPE AND PURCHASED FROM THE SAME HATCHERY AND HATCH DATE.
- B. BIRDS MUST BE WING BANDED AND BAND NUMBERS MUST MATCH EXHIBITOR'S NAME. TURKEY'S LOSING THEIR WING BAND, FOR WHATEVER REASON, WILL BE SIFTED.
- C. NO WEIGHT LIMIT.
- D. BIRDS WILL BE SIFTED ON QUALITY (GRADE A).
- E. EACH EXHIBITOR MAY SHOW TWO ENTRIES – ONE IN EACH CLASS (ONE TOM & ONE HEN)
- F. TOMS AND HENS WILL BE SHOWN IN SEPARATE CLASSES.
- G. AFTER SHOW JUDGING, EXHIBITOR'S MUST TAKE HOME ALL NON-PLACING BIRDS.

VI. BREEDING SWINE:

- A. ANIMALS MUST BE REGISTERED IN EXHIBITOR'S NAME AND EXHIBITOR MUST BE ABLE TO SHOW REGISTRATION PAPERS. THE OWNERSHIP DATE WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE DATE OF OWNERSHIP ON THE REGISTRATION PAPERS.
- B. TWO AGE GROUPS WILL BE SHOWN:
 - JUNIORS - ANIMALS BORN AUGUST 15 AND AFTER;
 - SENIORS - ANIMALS BORN JULY TO AUGUST 14.
- C. ONE GILT PER EXHIBITOR MAY BE SHOWN IN EACH CLASS.
- D. NO BOARS CAN BE SHOWN IN THIS DIVISION.
- E. GILTS ARE TO BE SHOWN BY BREEDS. ANY BREED MUST HAVE THREE ANIMALS TO CONSTITUTE A DIVISION OF THAT BREED. SHOULD A BREED NOT HAVE THREE ANIMALS, THE ANIMALS OF THAT BREED WILL BE SHOWN IN THE OTHER REGISTERED BREED(ORB) CLASS.
- F. THERE WILL BE NO SIFTING OF BREEDING SWINE.
- G. .A GRAND CHAMPION AND RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION GILT OF THE SHOW WILL BE SELECTED.

- J. ALL MARKET AND BREEDING SWINE WILL BE UNLOADED BETWEEN 3:00 PM AND 6:00 PM, ***WEDNESDAY JANUARY 25, 2012.*** ALL HOGS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 6:00 PM.

VII. BEEF BULLS:

- A. REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST BE IN THE EXHIBITOR'S NAME AND THE DATE OF OWNERSHIP WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE DATE ON THE REGISTRATION PAPERS (BEFORE NOVEMBER 1). ANIMALS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOW IF PAPERWORK IS NOT COMPLETE.

- C. EXHIBITOR MAY SHOW TWO HEIFERS PER CLASS.
- D. HEIFERS WILL SHOW BY INDIVIDUAL BREEDS. ANY BREED MUST HAVE THREE ANIMALS TO CONSTITUTE A DIVISION OF THAT BREED. SHOULD A BREED NOT HAVE THREE ANIMALS, THE ANIMALS OF THAT BREED WILL BE SHOWN AS OTHER REGISTERED AMERICAN BREED (ORAB), OTHER REGISTERED ENGLISH BREED (OREB) OR OTHER REGISTERED BREED (ORB). A CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION AMERICAN, BRITISH, AND EXOTIC HEIFER WILL BE SELECTED FROM THE BREED CHAMPIONS. THE THREE CHAMPIONS WILL COMPETE FOR GRAND CHAMPION HEIFER. AFTER THE SELECTION OF THE GRAND CHAMPION, THE RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION WILL BE SELECTED FROM THE TWO REMAINING DIVISION CHAMPIONS AND THE RESERVE CHAMPION BROUGHT OVER AFTER THE CHOICE OF THE OVERALL CHAMPION.
- E. AGED COW CLASS - (2-3 YEARS OLD) MUST PROVIDE A VETERINARIAN'S CERTIFICATE AS PROOF OF PREGNANCY OR HAVE A CALF BY SIDE.
- F. SHOULD BE NO CHANGE OR ALTERING OF THE ANIMAL'S MAJOR COLOR OR COLOR PATTERNS. THE USE OF TWINE, STRINGING OR ANY FOREIGN OBJECT, WILL BE PROHIBITED IN ANY FITTING PRACTICE. ANY VIOLATION OF THESE RULES WILL CONSTITUTE DISQUALIFICATION.

- D. ALL BREEDING RABBITS WILL BE BROKEN UP INTO SHOWROOM CLASSES ACCORDING TO BREED, AGE AND WEIGHT. RULES FOUND IN A.R.B.A. STANDARD OF PERFECTION.
- E. THIS WILL BE A LEAK PROOF CARRYING CAGE SHOW. RABBITS WILL BE PRESENTED BY THE EXHIBITOR TO THE JUDGE AT THE TIME OF JUDGING. PICK UP REMARK CARDS AFTER THE SHOW.
- F. RABBIT MUST BE OWNED AND CARED FOR 101 DAYS PRIOR TO THE SHOW. ENTRY FEE \$6.00 PER HEAD AND MUST BE SUBMITTED ON OR BEFORE ***DECEMBER 1, 2011.***

XI. MARKET GOATS:

- A. ENTRY - TWO ANIMALS PER CHILD. THE EXHIBITOR WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE HORNS TIPPED ON ALL GOATS BEFORE ARRIVAL. ALL MALES MUST BE CASTRATED. NO BRED FEMALES.
- B. ELIGIBILITY - THE SHOW IS OPEN TO ANY BREED OR CROSSBREED.
- C. AGE - GOATS MUST HAVE THEIR MILK TEETH IN NORMAL POSITION AT THE TIME OF VALIDATION. ANY ANIMAL HAVING LOST ONE OR BOTH THEIR MILK TEETH WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.
- D. HAIR - GOATS WILL BE SLICK SHORN OR CLIPPED TO WITHIN 1/4" OF THE SKIN ABOVE KNEE AND HOCK JOINTS, EXCLUDING THE TAIL SWITCH AT THE TIME OF WEIGH-IN..
- E. WEIGHING - ANIMALS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO CLASSES OF NOT MORE THAN 20 PER CLASS. BOTH SEXES OF ANIMALS WILL SHOW IN THE SAME CLASSES. **WEIGHT - 60LBS. XIV. AG. MECHANICS

ELIGIBLE ENTRIES: ENTRIES IN THIS DIVISION ARE LIMITED TO FFA AND 4-H MEMBERS. ENTRIES MUST BE INCLUDED ON THE OFFICIAL GROUP SUMMARY SHEET SUBMITTED BY THE CEA OR AST. PROJECTS EXHIBITED MUST BE CONSTRUCTED BY FFA AND 4-H MEMBERS UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE CEA OR AST, EITHER AS A PART OF THEIR AGRICULTURAL MECHANICS INSTRUCTION IN AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE OR AS A PART OF THEIR SUPERVISED WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM.

CONSTRUCTION DATE: A PROJECT CAN BE EXHIBITED ONLY ONE TIME AT THE WCJLS AND MUST HAVE BEEN COMPLETED WITHIN ONE CALENDAR YEAR OF THE EXHIBITION DATE.

PROJECT PRESENTATION: ALL PROJECTS MUST BE PAINTED OR PROPERLY TREATED AND MUST BE CLEAN AND IN PRESENTABLE CONDITION, EVEN THOUGH THEY MAY HAVE BEEN USED. DUE TO LIMITED PRIMARY EXHIBIT SPACE, TRAILERS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT ARE TO BE DISPLAYED IN TRANSPORT POSITION. FLOOR COVERING, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF RESTORED TRACTORS, IS NOT ENCOURAGED. WHEN USED, IT MUST BE LIMITED TO THE FLOOR AREA UNDER

DOCUMENTATION MUST BE TYPED OR COMPUTER GENERATED AND IS TO INCLUDE A ONE PAGE DESCRIPTION OF THE OVERALL RESTORATION PROJECT, AN EXPENSE REPORT IDENTIFYING ALL COSTS OF RESTORATION, PHOTOS SHOWING BEFORE, DURING, AND AFTER RESTORATION THAT SHOW A SAFE WORKING ENVIRONMENT, AND A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF ALL MECHANICAL WORK PREFORMED. ALL DOCUMENTATION IS TO BE DISPLAYED IN A THREE-RING BINDER, DIVIDED AND SEQUENCED WITH A TABLE OF CONTENTS AND PAGE NUMBERS. THE NATIONAL FFA COMPETITION FORMAT AND FORMS MAY BE USED.

EXHIBITORS ARE TO PROVIDE PERTINENT INFORMATION, PREFERABLY FROM THE MANUFACTURER, ABOUT THE SPECIFIC TRACTOR RESTORED. INFORMATION SHOULD INCLUDED, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AN ILLUSTRATION OR PHOTO,(PREFERABLY COLOR) TO DEPICT THE ORIGINAL COLOR (S, PAINT SCHEME, AND ORIGINAL DECALS AND THEIR LOCATION; CHARGING AND CRANKING SYSTEM INFORMATION (EXAMPLE: 1951 AND OLDER MODEL XXXS WERE HAND CRANKED, IN 1952, A 6 VOLT CHARGING SYSTEM AND ELECTRIC STARTER WAS A FACTORY OPTION FOR MODEL XXXS, IN 1954, ALL MODEL XXX WERE EQUIPPED WITH A 6 VOLT CHARGING SYSTEM AND ELECTRIC STARTER); LIGHTS AND SAFETY EQUIPMENT; WHEEL AND TIRE TYPES AND SIZES; OTHER FACTORY OPTIONS; AND MANUFACTURER APPROVED FIELD INSTALLED OPTIONS MADE AVAILABLE DURING THE TIME THE MODEL XXX WAS IN PRODUCTION.

XV. HORSE SHOW

EXHIBITOR & SHOW RULES:

1. **CHECK IN FOR THE LIVESTOCK SHOW WILL BE FROM 2:00 – 3:00 P.M. WITH CLASSES BEGINNING AT 6:00 P.M., TUESDAY, JANUARY 24, 2012.** CLASSES WILL BE AS FOLLOWS: YEARLING TO TWO-YEAR-OLD HALTER (MARE AND GELDING), THREE-YEAR-OLD TO FIVE-YEAR-OLD HALTER (MARE AND GELDING), AGED HALTER (MARE AND GELDING), AND SHOWMANSHIP AT HALTER. AN EXHIBITOR MAY SHOW A MAXIMUM OF 2 HORSES; HOWEVER AN EXHIBITOR CAN ONLY SHOW ONE HORSE PER CLASS.
2. THE EXHIBITOR MUST RAISE THEIR HORSE PROJECT. EXHIBITORS MUST CONTINUOUSLY AND PERSONALLY OWN AND CARE FOR HIS/HER HORSE PROJECT THROUGHOUT THE FEEDING PERIOD. THE EXHIBITOR MUST FEED, CARE FOR, FIT AND EXHIBIT THE ANIMAL ENTERED WITH AID OR ASSISTANCE FROM ANYONE OTHER THAN A HIRED PROFESSIONAL FITTER.
3. HORSES MUST RESIDE AT THE EXHIBITOR'S RESIDENCE. IF IT IS NOT POSSIBLE FOR THE HORSE TO RESIDE AT EXHIBITOR'S RESIDENCE, IT IS REQUIRED TO STATE THE PHYSICAL LOCATION OF THE HORSE. NO HORSE PROJECT IS ALLOWED TO BE KEPT AT ANY TYPE OF TRAINER OR TRAINING FACILITIES FROM THE TIME THE EXHIBITOR OWNS THE HORSE THROUGH THE COMPLETION OF THE WILSON COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOW.
4. **ALL HORSES MUST BE A YEARLING OR OLDER AS OF JANUARY 1, 2012.**
5. **ALL HORSES TO BE EXHIBITED ARE REQUIRED TO BE VALIDATED ON OCTOBER 22, 2011.** EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT PROOF OF VACCINATIONS, CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS AND REGISTRATION OR GRADE PAPERS (IF APPLICABLE) ALL HORSES WILL BE TAPED FOR HEIGHT, MEASURED FOR HEIGHT, AND PHOTOGRAPHED FOR IDENTIFICATION
6. THE SHOW IS OPEN TO ALL BREEDS.
7. A CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS AND YOUR HORSES CURRENT SHOT RECORD WILL NEED TO BE ON FILE FOR ALL HORSE ENTRIES AND HORSE MUST BE IN GOOD HEALTH UPON ARRIVAL AT THE WILSON COUNTY LIVESTOCK BARN FOR THE LIVESTOCK SHOW. SOUNDNESS OF THE HORSES WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE JUDGE. THE JUDGE HAS THE RIGHT TO DISQUALIFY ANY HORSE FOR ILLNESS OR LAMENESS. CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS MUST BE PRESENT UPON CHECK IN FOR THE SHOW.
8. THE SHOW WILL BE CONDUCTED ACCORDING TO AQHA RULES AND REGULATIONS WHERE APPLICABLE. HALTER CLASSES WILL BE JUDGED WITH CONSIDERATION AS TO THE MODEL QUALITIES OF THE DIFFERENT BREEDS EXHIBITED. WILSON COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES AND HORSE PROJECT RULES TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER AQHA RULES.

SPECIES RULES

SHOWMANSHIP AT HALTER

1. THE DIVISIONS IN THE SHOWMANSHIP CLASS ARE AS FOLLOWS:
 - A. JUNIOR (8-11)
 - B. INTERMEDIATE (12-14)
 - C. SENIOR (15-18).
2. SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES ARE ONLY OPEN TO EXHIBITORS AND HORSES ENTERED IN A HALTER CLASS.

IN HAND TRAIL

I. General Class Rules

1. Western Attire
2. HALTER WITH APPROPRIATE LEAD
 - A. A CHAIN MAY BE USED UNDER THE CHIN OR HANGING FROM THE HALTER
3. Banding and/or braiding of mane or tail optional
4. AN EXHIBITOR MAY SHOW A MAXIMUM OF TWO HORSES IN IN-HAND TRAIL
 - A. OPEN TO ANY HORSE VALIDATED FOR WCJLS
 - i. NO REQUIREMENTS TO SHOW IN A WCJLS HALTER CLASS

II. Judging Guidelines

- B. JUDGES SHOULD CONSIDER THE OVERALL APPEARANCE OF THE HORSE, CONDITIONING AND GROOMING, AND THE EQUIPMENT (DIRTY, ILL-FITTING OR RAGGED EQUIPMENT) IN THEIR OVERALL SCORES. ALSO TO BE CONSIDERED IS THE CORRECTNESS OF THE HORSE WHILE BEING LED. DRIFTING TO THE SIDE, LEADING OR STOPPING CROOKED, FAILURE TO MAINTAIN A PIVOT FOOT IN A TURN, LEADING OR TURNING SLUGGISHLY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED AND EVALUATED IN THE HORSE'S MANEUVER SCORES AND REFLECTED IN HIS OVERALL SCORE. HANDLERS SHOULD BE DISCOURAGED FROM EXCESSIVE VERBAL CUES AND EXCESSIVE STIFF OR UNNATURAL MOVEMENTS AROUND HORSE OR WHEN LEADING. FOR SAFETY REASONS, THOSE HANDLERS CONTINUOUSLY HOLDING THE CHAIN ON THE LEAD, TIGHTLY COILING LEAD SHANK AROUND HAND, OR DRAGGING THE LEAD SHANK SHOULD BE PENALIZED.
- C. ALL FAULTS ARE TO BE ASSESSED AGAINST THE HORSE AND NOT THE EXHIBITOR (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SCORING SYSTEM 3.B.)

III. Scoring System

SCORING WILL BE ON THE BASIS OF 0-INFINITY, WITH 70 DENOTING AN AVERAGE PERFORMANCE. EACH OBSTACLE WILL RECEIVE AN OBSTACLE SCORE THAT SHOULD BE ADDED OR SUBTRACTED FROM 70 AND IS SUBJECT TO A PENALTY THAT SHOULD BE SUBTRACTED. EACH OBSTACLE WILL BE SCORED ON THE FOLLOWING BASIS, RANGING FROM PLUS 1 ½ TO MINUS 1 ½: -1 ½ EXTREMELY POOR, -1 VERY POOR, -½ POOR, 0 CORRECT, +½ GOOD, +1 VERY GOOD, +1½ EXCELLENT. OBSTACLE SCORES ARE TO BE DETERMINED AND ASSESSED INDEPENDENTLY OF PENALTY POINTS. CREDIT WILL BE GIVEN TO THOSE HORSES NEGOTIATING THE OBSTACLES CLEANLY, SMOOTHLY, AND ALERTLY WITH STYLE IN PROMPT RESPONSE TO THE HANDLER'S CUES. PENALTIES SHOULD BE ASSESSED PER OCCURRENCE AS FOLLOWS:

1. ONE HALF (½) POINT
 - A. EACH TICK OF LOG, POLE, CONE, PLANT OR OBSTACLE
2. ONE (1) POINT
 - A. EACH HIT OF OR STEPPING ON A LOG, POLE, CONE OR OBSTACLE
 - B. INCORRECT OR BREAK OF GAIT AT WALK OR JOG FOR TWO STRIDES OR LESS
 - C. BOTH FRONT OR HIND FEET IN A SINGLE-STRIDE SLOT OR SPACE
 - D. SKIPPING OVER OR FAILING TO STEP INTO REQUIRED SPACE
 - E. FAILURE TO MEET THE CORRECT STRIDES ON TROT OVER LOG OBSTACLES
3. THREE (3) POINTS
 - A. INCORRECT OR BREAK OF GAIT AT WALK OR JOG FOR MORE THAN 2 STRIDES
 - B. KNOCKING DOWN AN ELEVATED POLE, CONE, BARREL, PLANT OR OBSTACLE, OR SEVERELY DISTURBING AN OBSTACLE UNLESS CAUSED BY THE TAIL
 - C. STEPPING OUTSIDE THE CONFINES OF, FALLING OR JUMPING OFF OR OUT OF AN OBSTACLE WITH ONE FOOT ONCE THE FOOT HAS ENTERED OBSTACLE; INCLUDING MISSING ONE ELEMENT OF AN OBSTACLE ON A LINE OF TRAVEL WITH ONE FOOT
4. FIVE (5) POINTS
 - A. DROPPING SLICKER OR OBJECT REQUIRED TO BE CARRIED ON COURSE

SPECIES RULES

- B. FIRST OR SECOND CUMULATIVE REFUSAL, BALK, OR EVADING AN OBSTACLE BY SHYING OR BACKING
 - C. LETTING GO OF GATE OR DROPPING ROPE GATE
 - D. USE OF EITHER HAND TO INSTILL FEAR OR PRAISE (SLIGHT TOUCHING OR TAPPING WITH ONE HAND TO CUE HORSE IN A SIDE PASS MANEUVER ONLY IS ACCEPTABLE)
 - E. STEPPING OUTSIDE THE CONFINES OF, FALLING OR JUMPING OFF OR OUT OF AN OBSTACLE WITH MORE THAN ONE FOOT ONCE THE FOOT HAS ENTERED OBSTACLE; INCLUDING MISSING ONE ELEMENT OF AN OBSTACLE ON A LINE OF TRAVEL WITH MORE THAN ONE FOOT
 - F. BLATANT DISOBEDIENCE (INCLUDING KICKING OUT, BUCKING, REARING, STRIKING OR CONTINUOUSLY CIRCLING THE EXHIBITOR)
5. ZERO (0) TOTAL SCORE FOR COURSE (DISQUALIFICATION)
- A. PERFORMING THE OBSTACLES OTHER THAN IN SPECIFIED ORDER
 - B. NO ATTEMPT TO PERFORM AN OBSTACLE
 - C. EQUIPMENT FAILURE THAT DELAYS COMPLETION OF PATTERN
 - D. EXCESSIVELY OR REPEATEDLY TOUCHING THE HORSE
 - E. FAILURE TO ENTER, EXIT OR WORK OBSTACLE IN ANY MANNER OTHER THAN HOW IT'S DESCRIBED, INCLUDING OVERTURNS OF MORE THAN 1/4 TURN
 - F. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE CORRECT LINE OF TRAVEL BETWEEN OBSTACLES
 - G. WORKING OUTSIDE DESIGNATED BOUNDARY MARKER OF THE ARENA OR COURSE AREA
 - H. THIRD CUMULATIVE REFUSAL, BALK, OR EVADING AN OBSTACLE BY SHYING OR BACKING OVER ENTIRE COURSE
 - I. FAILURE TO DEMONSTRATE CORRECT GAIT BETWEEN OBSTACLES AS DESIGNATED
 - J. HORSE GETS LOOSE FROM EXHIBITOR
 - K. LEADING ON THE WRONG SIDE OF THE HORSE
 - I. *LEADING, BACKING AND WORKING OBSTACLES SHOULD BE PERFORMED FROM THE LEFT SIDE OF THE HORSE*

IV. Course Requirements

1. USE CARE IN SETTING UP COURSE. CARE MUST BE EXERCISED TO AVOID THE SETTING UP OF ANY OF THESE OBSTACLES IN A MANNER THAT MAY BE HAZARDOUS TO THE HORSE OR HANDLER. OBSTACLES SHOULD BE PLACED IN SUCH A MANNER THAT THEY FLOW FROM ONE TO THE OTHER QUICKLY AND EFFICIENTLY.
2. CHANGE OF PROCEDURE. WHERE THE LOCAL CONDITIONS AND EQUIPMENT WILL NOT PERMIT THE ESTABLISHMENT OF OBSTACLES AS SPECIFIED AND THAT THEY MAY REQUIRE CHANGING OF PROCEDURES OR HAND ON THE LEAD, THEN ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE ADVISED THAT SUCH CHANGING OF PROCEDURE OR OF HANDS IS PERMITTED.

V. Exhibitor Requirements

1. EXHIBITOR MUST USE ONLY THE RIGHT HAND ON THE LEAD WHERE THE CHAIN BEGINS, AND LEAD ON THE HORSE'S LEFT SIDE. A CHAIN MAY BE USED UNDER THE CHIN OR HANGING FROM THE HALTER. EXHIBITOR MUST USE ONLY THE LEFT HAND TO CARRY THE EXCESS LEAD, LOOPED LOOSELY EXCEPT WHEN:
 - A. CARRYING AN OBJECT FROM ONE PART OF THE ARENA TO ANOTHER
 - B. DRAGGING AN OBJECT FROM ONE PART OF THE ARENA TO ANOTHER
 - C. OPENING/CLOSING A GATE, LEFT HAND GATE ONLY. IN THESE CASES, THE RIGHT HAND CAN ALSO CARRY THE EXCESS LEAD
 - D. SIDE-PASSING. IN THIS CASE, THE LEAD AT THE CHAIN AND THE EXCESS LEAD CAN BE HELD IN THE HAND AT THE HORSE'S HEAD
2. EXHIBITORS SHOULD BE POISED, CONFIDENT, COURTEOUS AND SPORTSMANLIKE AT ALL TIMES. THE EXHIBITOR SHOULD CONTINUE SHOWING THE HORSE UNTIL THE CLASS HAS BEEN PLACED OR EXCUSED
3. ANY STOPS SHOULD BE STRAIGHT, SMOOTH AND RESPONSIVE WITH THE HORSE'S BODY REMAINING STRAIGHT. BACKING AND TURNING SHOULD BE PERFORMED FROM THE LEFT SIDE OF THE HORSE. THE EXHIBITOR SHOULD FACE THE HORSE WHEN BACKING. EXCEPTION: WHEN NEGOTIATING A GATE, THE EXHIBITOR IS NOT REQUIRED TO FACE THE HORSE. THE HORSE SHOULD BACK UP READILY WITH THE HEAD, NECK AND BODY ALIGNED IN A STRAIGHT OR CURVED LINE AS INSTRUCTED
4. WHEN EXECUTING A TURN TO THE RIGHT, THE EXHIBITOR SHOULD FACE THE HORSE AND MOVE THE HORSE AWAY FROM THEM. ON TURNS OF LESS THAN 90 DEGREES, IT IS ACCEPTABLE TO LEAD THE HORSE TOWARD THEM. ON TURNS OF 90 DEGREES OR GREATER, THE HORSE SHOULD PIVOT ON THE RIGHT OR LEFT HIND LEG WHILE STEPPING ACROSS WITH THE FRONT LEGS
5. EXHIBITOR IS NOT ALLOWED TO TOUCH THE HORSE, EXCEPT WHEN SIDE PASSING

SPECIES RULES

VI. Obstacle Requirements

COURSE WILL INCLUDE A MINIMUM OF 6 AND A MAXIMUM OF 8 OBSTACLES AND MUST BE DESIGNED USING OBSTACLES FROM EACH OF THE FOLLOWING DIVISIONS WITH A MAXIMUM OF 2 OBSTACLES PER DIVISION.

1. DIVISION A

A. WALK-OVER

- I. AN OBSTACLE OF AT LEAST FOUR POLES MEASURING 20 INCHES TO 24 INCHES BETWEEN POLES, EITHER ON THE GROUND OR RAISED WITH A MAXIMUM CENTER HEIGHT OF 10 INCHES. THESE CAN BE IN A STRAIGHT LINE, CURVED OR ZIGZAG.

B. TROT-OVER

- I. AN OBSTACLE OF AT LEAST FOUR POLES MEASURING 36 INCHES TO 42 INCHES BETWEEN POLES, EITHER ON THE GROUND OR RAISED WITH A MAXIMUM CENTER HEIGHT OF 10 INCHES. THESE CAN BE IN A STRAIGHT LINE, CURVED OR ZIGZAG. NOTE: A CURVED OR ZIGZAG DESIGN IS MEASURED FOR DISTANCE BETWEEN THE POLES, FROM CENTER OF THE LENGTH OF THE POLE TO THE CENTER OF THE LENGTH OF THE NEXT POLE.

2. DIVISION B.

- A. SIDE-PASS. AN OBJECT OF SUCH NATURE AND LENGTH, WHICH IS SAFE, MAY BE USED TO DEMONSTRATE THE RESPONSIVENESS OF THE HORSE TO SIGNALS AT ITS SIDE. IF RAISED, HEIGHT MAY NOT EXCEED 2 FEET. THE OBSTACLE SHOULD BE DESIGNED TO REQUIRE THE HORSE TO SIDE PASS, TO THE RIGHT OR LEFT, OFF PRESSURE OR SIGNAL, ON OR NEAR ITS SIDE. THE OBSTACLE SHOULD BE IN THE COURSE DESIGN SUCH THAT THE HORSE COMES UP TO IT, BUT DOES NOT CROSS OR STRADDLE IT WHILE COMPLETING THE SIDE PASS. THE EXHIBITOR IS ALLOWED TO TOUCH THE HORSE ON THE SIDE DURING THE SIDE PASS.
- B. LIME CIRCLE. REQUIRING EITHER:
 - I. TURN ON THE FOREHAND WITH FRONT FEET INSIDE AND BACK FEET TURNING OUTSIDE THE CIRCLE. THE HANDLER MAY HOLD THE HORSE AND THE EXCESS LEAD IN HIS/HER LEFT HAND DURING THE TURN.
 - II. TURN ON THE HAUNCHES WITH HIND FEET INSIDE AND FRONT FEET TURNING OUTSIDE THE CIRCLE.
- C. SQUARE, MINIMUM 8' SIDES. LEAD INTO THE SQUARE. WHILE ALL FOUR FEET ARE CONFINED IN THE SQUARE, MAKE A 360 DEGREE OR LESS TURN AND LEAD OUT. HANDLER'S FEET SHOULD REMAIN IN SQUARE ALSO.
- D. GATE. THE GATE MUST BE SET UP SO THAT IT IS A MINIMUM OF FOUR FEET IN LENGTH AND FOUR FEET IN HEIGHT AND SO THAT THE EXHIBITOR CAN OPEN FROM HIS/HER LEFT SIDE. IT IS PERMISSIBLE TO CARRY EXCESS LEAD IN THE RIGHT HAND WHILE NEGOTIATING THE GATE. HANDLERS LOSING CONTROL OF THE GATE WHILE PASSING THROUGH SHALL BE PENALIZED AND SCORED ACCORDINGLY.

3. DIVISION C.

A. BACK THROUGH. SHALL CONSIST OF EITHER:

- I. POLES. STRAIGHT L, DOUBLE L, V, U OR SIMILAR SHAPED OBSTACLE. POLES SHOULD BE ON THE GROUND, 30 INCHES BETWEEN MINIMUM. HANDLER MAY REMAIN OUTSIDE OR INSIDE THE POLES.
- II. BARRELS OR CONES, MINIMUM OF THREE. 36 INCHES BETWEEN MINIMUM. HANDLER AND HORSE CAN PASS BETWEEN BARRELS OR CONES TOGETHER.
- III. TRIANGLE. 36 INCHES BETWEEN MINIMUM AT ENTRY AND 40 INCHES BETWEEN MINIMUM FOR SIDES. NOTE: IF GUARDRAILS ARE USED WITH B. OR C. THEY SHALL BE 3 TO 4 FEET FROM THE SIDES OF THE OBSTACLE.

- B. BRIDGE. A BRIDGE WITH A WOODEN FLOOR NOT TO EXCEED 12 INCHES IN HEIGHT AND WITH OR WITHOUT SIDE RAILS NOT LESS THAN 48 INCHES APART WILL BE USED.
- C. WATER HAZARD. A DITCH OR SHALLOW POND OF WATER MAY BE USED. A HORSE MUST PASS THROUGH THIS OBSTACLE, WHICH MUST BE LARGE ENOUGH SO THAT TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THIS OBSTACLE ALL FOUR FEET OF THE HORSE MUST STEP IN THE WATER. MANAGEMENT MAY NOT PLACE ANY ITEM IN THE WATER. IF A BOX IS USED, SIMULATED WATER IS PERMISSIBLE. IF WATER IS USED, HANDLER SHOULD WALK TO LEFT OF WATER WHILE HORSE PASSES THROUGH WATER.
- D. SIMULATED WATER. A PLASTIC SHEET, SECURED TO THE GROUND, SO THAT IT WILL NOT BECOME AFFIXED TO THE HORSE'S FOOT WHEN A HORSE PASSES OVER THE SIMULATED WATER.

4. DIVISION D.

- A. CARRYING OBJECT. ANY OBJECT, OTHER THAN ANIMAL OR FOWL, AND OF A REASONABLE SIZE OR WEIGHT, MAY BE CARRIED TO A SPECIFIC POINT.
- B. DRAG OR PULL. ANY OBJECT OTHER THAN ANIMAL OR FOWL WHICH CAN REASONABLY BE PULLED OR DRAGGED BY THE EXHIBITOR. THIS OBSTACLE SHOULD BE IN THE COURSE DESIGN SUCH THAT THE ITEM TO BE DRAGGED IS ON THE HANDLER'S LEFT SIDE. THE EXCESS LEAD MAY BE CARRIED IN THE HANDLER'S RIGHT HAND.
- C. MAILBOX. REMOVE AND/OR REPLACE ITEMS. SIDE PASS IS OPTIONAL.

SPECIES RULES

- I. NOTE: OBSTACLES 1 AND 3—IF THE OBJECT WILL BE PICKED UP/PUT DOWN OR OPENED/CLOSED ON THE HORSE'S RIGHT SIDE, THE HANDLER IS ALLOWED TO HOLD THE HORSE AND THE EXCESS LEAD IN HIS/HER LEFT HAND WHILE NEGOTIATING THE OBSTACLE.
- D. ANIMAL HIDE. LEAD NEXT TO AN ANIMAL HIDE.
- E. SERPENTINE. OBSTACLE CONSISTING OF FOUR PYLONS, GUARDRAILS OPTIONAL, THROUGH WHICH A HORSE WILL MANEUVER AT A WALK OR JOG-TROT. GUARDRAILS SHALL CONSIST OF POLES PLACED PARALLEL AND A MINIMUM OF 4 FEET FROM THE BASE OF PYLONS; WALK-PYLONS, MINIMUM 4 FEET APART, BASE TO BASE. JOG-TROT PYLONS, MINIMUM 7 FEET APART, BASE TO BASE.
- F. JOG-AROUND. SQUARE CONSISTING OF 4 POLES, MINIMUM 12 FEET LONG, AND A PYLON PLACED IN THE CENTER OF THE SQUARE. EXHIBITOR WILL ENTER OVER A DESIGNATED POLE, PERFORM A MINIMUM 90 DEGREE JOG AROUND THE PYLON AND EXIT OVER THE DESIGNATED POLE. THE HANDLER SHOULD BE IN THE BOX WITH THE HORSE.
- G. JOG-THROUGH. SHALL CONSIST OF POLES L, DOUBLE L, V, U OR SIMILAR SHAPED OBSTACLE. POLES SHOULD BE ON THE 3 FEET MINIMUM AND 4 FEET MAXIMUM. HANDLER MAY BE INSIDE OR OUTSIDE THE JOG-THROUGH.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

ALL LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY MUST COMPLY WITH THE CURRENT TEXAS ANIMAL HEALTH COMMISSION RULES AND REGULATIONS. SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR SHOW. EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO CERTIFY THAT THEIR MARKET ENTRY HAS NOT BEEN ADMINISTERED ANY SUBSTANCE NOT APPROVED BY THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION (FDA) AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (USDA) FOR SLAUGHTER ANIMALS. NOR WILL THE SAID ANIMAL BE WITHIN ANY WITHDRAWAL TIME RELATIVE TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF ANY DRUG, CHEMICAL OR FEED ADDITIVE APPROVED BY THE FDA OR USDA AT THE TIME THE ANIMAL IS OFFICIALLY WEIGHED IN AT THE SHOW. THIS CERTIFICATION WILL BE ON THE BACK OF THE ENTRY CARDS. *REVISED 4/11/11*
