- I. GENERAL RULES
  - A. All entries must be exhibited by bona-fide 4-H or FFA members attending La Vernia ISD Public Schools.
  - B. Any participant exhibiting in the Wilson County Junior Livestock or Baked Food Show, Bexar County Livestock Show, or Guadalupe County Livestock Show will not be allowed to participate in the La Vernia Baked Food Show.
  - C. NO PASS, NO BAKE. Eligibility rules will comply with the current UIL rules. All exhibitors must be grade eligible to show according to current UIL rules. Exhibitors must be eligible at the start of the La Vernia Junior Livestock Show, Thursday, February 27, 2013, at 12:00 P.M.
  - D. Each exhibitor may have two (2) entries in the Baked Food Show. Only one entry may be made in each category.
  - E. The following are categories to exhibit in the Baked Food Show:
    - 1. <u>Cookies</u>: drop, rolled or shaped; a recipe amount (2 dozen or more).
    - 2. <u>Bars</u>: baked in oblong or sheet pan and cut into uniform size pieces; a recipe amount (not less than 20 bars).
    - 3. <u>Iced Cakes</u>: layered, oblong, tube or bundt; cakes must be frosted, iced or glazed; icings, frostings and fillings must be made from scratch.
    - 4. <u>Uniced Cakes</u>: pound, bundt, loaf, etc.; no frosting as is directly from the over, or may have a <u>light glaze</u>, drizzle or sprinkle with powdered sugar.
    - 5. <u>Yeast Breads</u>: sweet or non-sweet yeast, i.e, loaf bread, kolaches, dinner, sweet or cinnamon rolls; must exhibit a complete recipe (at least 1 dozen rolls or 1 loaf); if recipe states makes 2 loaves-need to exhibit 2 loaves.
    - 6. <u>Quick Breads</u>: fruit and nut breads, coffee cakes, muffins, tortillas, biscuits, any <u>non-yeast</u> breads; must exhibit a complete recipe (at least 1 dozen muffins, biscuits, etc. or 1 loaf); if recipe states makes 2 loaves-need to exhibit 2 loaves.
    - 7. <u>Pies</u>: fruit or custard; meringue pies and pies that make their own crust are allowed; pie crust must be made from scratch; no icebox pies or cheesecakes; DO NOT CUT PIE!
  - F. Each category will be judged in the following two divisions:

Junior (3<sup>rd</sup> thru 7<sup>th</sup> grades) Senior (8<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> grades)

- G. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to determine the proper entry category. An item entered in the wrong category or that does not meet all the entry standards (item I.E. above) will be changed to the proper category at judges' discretion, and *entry may be subject to point deduction*.
- H. The Baked Food Show Committee has the final and absolute right to interpret these rules, and the right to amend and add to these rules as its judgment may determine. Decisions of the Baked Food Show Committee will be final in all cases (as per general La Vernia Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations).
- I. All exhibitors who sell an item through the bid sale are required to send a thank you letter to each buyer or add on. Participants not eligible for the bid sale that sell their entries are also required to send a thank you letter.

#### II. ENTRY FORM AND FEE

- A. Entry fee will be **\$10.00 per entry** (limit 2 categories).
- B. Refund of entry fees will not be made after the closing date for entries.
- C. All applications for entry must be made on the printed entry form attached to these Rules or which may be secured from the Baked Food Show Committee, County Extension Agent, local 4-H leaders or FFA advisors.
- D. The completed entry form and entry fee for the Baked Food Show must be received by a 4-H leader, FFA advisor or Baked Food Show Committee member not later than the date stated on page 1.

#### III. FOOD ENTRY PREPARATION RULES

- A. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE BAKED OR COOKED. All food entries must be made from scratch and no ready-mixed foods may be used. NO CANNED OR BOXED MIXES OR CANNED PIE FILLING FOR THE MAIN INGREDIENT, NO CANNED OR BOXED ICINGS/FROSTINGS OR PURCHASED CRUSTS, ETC., NO CHEESECAKES. All entries must be the work of one individual.
- B. It is illegal for minors to be in possession of alcohol; therefore, recipes which call for these kinds of ingredients are inappropriate.
- C. The Baked Food Show Committee has been advised by the County Extension Agent, Family & Consumer Sciences/Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, of requirements for food safety for products entered which require refrigeration or chilling within two hours after baking. The Committee has <u>waived</u> the requirement of not allowing dairy products (i.e., cream cheese and sour cream) in fillings or frostings, and undercooked eggs (i.e., in meringues). **Caution should be taken in choosing recipes with questionable food safety.** Caution labels will be affixed to items to be sold warning purchasers that "food entries may contain products which require refrigeration or chilling within two hours after baking".
- D. Entries should be displayed in purchased containers (available through the Baked Food Show Committee) or boxes that are appropriate in size for the entry. The boxes should be cut so that the front section is removed, and the sides and bottom remain in place. Boxes may be covered inside and out with aluminum foil for cleanliness and attractiveness. After the entry is placed inside, the box must be covered with plastic wrap taped underneath so as to keep the entry fresh

and clean. Entry must be visible from outside any container for the judges' viewing. If recipe states cake must remain in the pan, disposable foil pan is allowed.

- E. A sample from each entry, such as one cookie, roll, piece of cake, etc., must be cut or taken from the entry. Place the sample on a small white disposable plate and wrap it with plastic wrap or slip it into a plastic zip bag, and place on top of the container so judges can sample without disturbing the wrap of the container. The cut side of the entry must be placed to the front of the container for the judges' viewing. (See diagrams that are shown on the last page.) **Do not cut pies.**
- F. Recipe:
  - 1. The recipe must include a complete list of ingredients, mixing and baking instructions (including pie crust, frosting, glaze, etc.), size of pan used, temperature, cooking time, and how much the recipe makes.
  - 2. The recipe must be typed or printed on a  $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$  inch sheet of paper (half sheet). If additional space is needed, attach additional pages (do not print on the back). *Entry may be subject to point deduction if the recipe is not submitted with entry.*
  - 3. Please submit <u>2 copies</u> of the recipe: (i) tape one recipe to the outside back of the container, print side facing out; and (ii) turn in one copy at time of check-in.
  - 4. Exhibitor's name <u>should not</u> appear on the recipe or container.
  - 5. Recipes may be published at a later date.
  - 6. Grand Champion may <u>not</u> enter that recipe again.

#### IV. JUDGING, AWARDS AND CHAMPION BID SALE

- A. Entries will be received at the time and date stated on page 1, at the Baked Food Show area of the La Vernia Chamber of Commerce grounds. *Late entries may be subject to point deduction.*
- B. Judging will begin promptly at the time and date stated on page 1.
- C. Exhibitors, parents, and the general public will not be admitted to the judging area until after judging is completed.
- D. After judging is completed a list of winners and the Bid Sale Sheet (showing order of sale) will be posted at the Baked Food Show area and entries will be available for public viewing. Eligible entries will be available for purchase after a sufficient time for public viewing.
- E. Best of Show is selected from the Grand Champion winners in each division. Trophies will be presented to Grand and Reserve Champion in each category, and banners to Best of Show in each division. Best of Show may win that title more than once (in that event the microwave oven, if awarded, will be awarded to the next highest Grand Champion).
- F. A microwave oven may be awarded to a Grand Champion winner in the Junior Division and in the Senior Division. The exhibitor may win the microwave oven only once.
- G. Baked Food entries will <u>not</u> be sold in the livestock auction on Saturday. Premiums (prize money) will be awarded and/or a separate baked food Champion Bid Sale will be held.

- H. An awards and Champion Bid Sale ceremony may be held on the date and time stated on page 1 at the livestock judging arena or other designated area. Grand and Reserve Champion entries will be eligible for the Champion Bid Sale. No substitutes will be allowed. Eligible exhibitors will be allowed to sell one (1) entry (baked food or craft). The highest placing entry will be required to sell. (1% 2% of the Champion Bid Sale proceeds may be deducted for expenses relating to the Champion Bid Sale.)
- I. Premiums (prize money) will be determined by the Baked Food Show Committee from entry fees and donations to the Baked Food Show though the Buyer's Pool and may be awarded to Grand Champion, Reserve Champion and third place entries.
- J. After the proceeds from the Champion Bid Sale are collected and processed, they will be distributed to the exhibitor or mailed to the exhibitor's address listed on the Entry Form.
- K. Entries not eligible for the Champion Bid Sale may be sold on behalf of the exhibitor by the Baked Food Show Committee at a donation price of \$20+ per item.
- L. Exhibitors should pick up baked goods, awards and/or monetary donations no later than **6:00 p.m. on the date of the show** at the Baked Food Show area. Unclaimed entries will be sold by the Baked Food Show Committee and funds donated to the Committee for premiums or unclaimed entries will be donated to the hospitality booth.


